The primary research focus is on memory and the executive functions of the brain, both in normal aging and in the presence of diseases and conditions which affect the brain, such as stroke, traumatic brain injury, Alzheimer's disease and other dementias. This fellowship is supervised by **Dr. Angela Troyer,** in collaboration with scientists and clinicians at Baycrest.
