Ph.D. in Health Behavior & Health Promotion

Graduate Assistantship Opportunities

The University of Arkansas Health Behavior & Health Promotion PhD program within the Department of Health, Human Performance, and Recreation is seeking Ph.D. level students for graduate assistants for summer/fall 2017 for a six-year research project. These 12 month graduate assistantship positions provide an annual stipend of \$16,000 plus full tuition waiver.

In addition to graduate assistantships, two categories of fellowships are available to qualified doctoral students. **Distinguished Doctoral Fellowships** and **Doctoral Academy Fellowships** are offered on a competitive basis. Distinguished Doctoral Fellows' stipends are approximately \$35,000 annually, and Doctoral Academy Fellows' stipends are approximately \$25,000 annually.

Minimum requirements for Distinguished Fellows include exceptional Master's GPA and GRE scores; for the Doctoral Academy Fellow, students must have an excellent GPA and GRE scores. Application deadline to be considered for the fellowships is January 7. Regular admission for the assistantships will be rolling until positions are filled.

Doctoral Program: The Ph.D. program in Health Behavior and Health Promotion is a research based degree, providing students with the knowledge, skills and experiences to become leading academicians and researchers in public health education and health promotion. Assistantship Description: Responsibilities for the graduate assistantship include assisting on a multiyear, interdisciplinary study aimed at developing and psychometrically assessing sexual and reproductive health measures for use in both English and Spanish social surveys. Positions will begin Summer or Fall 2018.

Drs. Kristen Jozkowski (PI; public health), Brandon Crawford (Co-PI; sociology), Ronna Turner and Wen-Juo Lo (Co-PIs; statistics and research methodology) are the leads for the project. Dr. Jozkowski will be the primary mentor for Health Behavior and Health Promotion doctoral students, with additional mentoring from the other investigators and researchers at the University of Arkansas and the National Opinions Research Center (NORC) at the University of Chicago. Students will be based in the Department of Health, Human Performance, and Recreation within the College of Education and Health Professions at the University of Arkansas.

There will be multiple phases of data collection in both English and Spanish during the formative and validation phases using both qualitative and quantitative methodologies. Graduate students will have multiple opportunities to work with data toward peer-reviewed publication and presentations.

Application Procedures: For acceptance into the Ph.D. program in Health Behavior & Health Promotion, the applicant must have completed a master's degree or its equivalent in Public Health or a related field and meet general admission requirements of the Graduate School. An application should include identification of applicant's objectives; three letters of recommendation; a GPA of at least 3.00 on all graduate course work; and an acceptable score on the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). Special consideration will be given to students who are fluent in both English and Spanish.
