The Department of Human Development and Family Science (HDFS) at the University of Georgia is seeking applicants for a tenure-track, Assistant or Associate Professor in Human Development and Family Science (Child Development/Quantitative Methodologist) position to begin August 2018. Applicants should have a strong background and scholarly record in and ability to teach courses in quantitative statistical methods and contribute to one or more of the department's research areas [http://www.fcs.uga.edu/hdfs].

**Qualifications:** Earned a Ph.D. in HDFS (or closely related area: psychology, sociology, social work), with a focus on child development, particularly infancy and early childhood, and with demonstrated experience in advanced quantitative analytical methods. The successful candidate must show clear and convincing evidence of emerging (for assistant rank) or established (for associate rank) stature in research, teaching, or public service in the child development discipline. Appointment at the Associate level requires a current appointment at that level at a comparable institution or five years' experience at the Assistant level. See <u>UGA's criteria for faculty appointment</u>, promotion and tenure.

**Preferred Qualifications:** Our preference is for candidates with in-depth preparation in quantitative research methodologies; an established program of scholarly research; and a minimum of three years of successful teaching experience at the graduate level. Priority will be given to applicants with a history of securing external research funding.

**Responsibilities:** Collaborate and contribute to an established curriculum in HDFS, at both graduate and undergraduate levels. Develop and maintain a rigorous, nationally-recognized research program in child development using advanced quantitative analytical strategies, secure funding from external sources and publish in peer-reviewed scholarly outlets; teach graduate advanced methodologies (e.g., multi-level modeling, growth mixture modeling), and child development at the HDFS. The successful candidate will demonstrate competencies in collaborating, fostering teamwork, and mentoring students in child development.

**Applications:** Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Full consideration will be given to applications received by November 15, 2017.
