



Research Analyst

The University of Nebraska Public Policy Center (PPC) is seeking a Research Analyst based in Lincoln to collect and analyze data, write reports, develop research methodology, assist with grant writing, and present findings that impact state, local and federal policy. The Research Analyst will join a diverse research interdisciplinary team within the PPC that engages in a variety of research and consultation activities involving private and public sector partners.

The Research Analyst position is open to applicants who have a Master's degree in quantitative methods, statistics, psychometrics, econometrics, epidemiology, or a related field plus two (2) years of experience with research design and presenting data in reports. Expertise in data analysis including, but not limited to, basic descriptives and frequencies, ANOVA, factor analysis, scale construction and validation, nonparametric approaches, structural equation modeling, multilevel modeling, longitudinal data analysis, and time series is required. Knowledge of research design methodologies and social science statistical analytic approaches and ability to conduct extensive data collection is required. The position requires outstanding interpersonal, planning, and writing skills and the ability to work effectively and collaboratively with national, state, and local policymakers and stakeholders. The ability to multitask and perform assigned tasks quickly and accurately is also required. All applicants must possess a valid driver's license and the ability to pass a DMV background check authorizing them to operate university vehicles.
