

## Continuing Faculty Position – Lecturer in Psychology Research Methods

### About the Position

The Department of Psychology at Simon Fraser University invites applications for a continuing faculty position at the rank of **Lecturer** in the area of **Research Methods**. The planned start for the position is August 7, 2017 or later.

### Qualifications

We seek a candidate with an outstanding record in designing and delivering Psychology courses and individualized methodological consultation. Applicants should have a completed Ph.D. in Psychology, Statistics (with specialization in methodology relevant to Psychology), or related field, at the time of appointment. Applicants should have demonstrated expertise in traditional research design and advanced quantitative methods, as well as breadth of knowledge of multiple methods. The successful candidate will have demonstrated teaching and research expertise in behavioral statistics, psychometrics, and/or multiple research methods, a strong record of methodological/statistical consultation, and have expertise and skills complementary to the existing strengths of the Department.

The successful candidate will join the Department's *History, Quantitative, and Theoretical Psychology* area, contributing to departmental teaching and participating in departmental activities and service including methodological/statistical consultation with faculty and students. Contributions to teaching may include our core and service courses in statistics, research methods (quantitative, qualitative, mixed methods), philosophy of psychological science, history and theory, and other courses as needed. ### Application procedure/materials:

- b) a curriculum vitae (including sections on relevant methodological training/coursework, and statistical/methodological consulting experience; please also note your citizenship / immigration status)
- c) a teaching statement and dossier of any available supporting materials, such as samples of course outlines and lecture materials, teaching evaluations, instructional workshops and training, etc., along with a summary of experience in methodology and statistics consultancy
- d) a research statement describing previous research experience and copies of 3-5 representative publications or comparable scholarly works. Materials submitted should illustrate the breadth and depth of the applicant's knowledge of research methods and varied advanced data analytic/strategies.
- e) names and contact details (including telephone number and email address) of three academic referees.
