FUNCTION:

The Psychological Wellness Centre (PWC) is an externally-funded clinical training facility devoted to advancing excellence in research and education in Clinical Psychology and is an integral part of the Ph.D. programme in Clinical Psychology offered by the Psychology Department at UNB. The purpose of the PWC is to provide experiential learning opportunities for graduate students in Clinical Psychology while offering low-cost psychological assessment and intervention services to the community of Fredericton and surrounding areas within a research and teaching context. The resident in Psychology will report to the Director of the PWC.

REPRESENTATIVE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide psychological services (i.e., assessment and therapy) to clients funded by third parties (e.g. Veterans' Affairs Canada, Blue Cross). The nature of services provided (i.e., type of the mental health issues addressed) will be dependent on the Resident's interests and skills.
- Responsible for maintaining appropriate records and providing third party reports within a reasonable time frame.
- Provide clinical supervision to graduate students in the clinical psychology programme providing assessment and therapy services to child/adolescent and adult clients.
- Develop and oversee a programme of research at the PWC within their area of interest or assist faculty members with research projects focused on PWC activities.
- Develop and submit grant applications for research funding.
- Assist the Director in management of the PWC and related activities.

REQUIREMENTS:

- Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology or equivalent. (Students with a Master's degree who have finished all PhD requirements except the thesis will be considered)
- Completion of a one-year internship (CPA accredited preferred).
- Must be eligible to apply for Interim Membership with the College of Psychologists of New Brunswick.
- Preference will be given to applicants with generalist training and the skills to work with both child/adolescent and adult populations
- Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled
