Applicants should have an exceptional record of research productivity, including extramural grants and publications reporting original research in leading journals, a national and international reputation, and evidence of excellence in teaching. Competitive salary and startup funds are available commensurate with experience. The Department of Clinical and Social Sciences in Psychology includes 16 faculty members in Clinical, Developmental, and Social-Personality Psychology. The department's areas of excellence include developmental psychopathology, interpersonal relationships, and motivation.
