

Tenure-Track Assistant Professor Position in Adult Clinical Psychology

The University of Windsor's Department of Psychology invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position at the rank of Assistant Professor in the area of Adult Clinical Psychology within the Clinical Psychology Program commencing July 1, 2016. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.

This position is one of 50 new tenure-track Assistant Professor appointments that the University of Windsor will make over the next three years as part of a visionary strategic investment in our students and faculty. This cohort of 50 new teachers, scholars, researchers, and creators will demonstrate both disciplinary grasp and interdisciplinary reach, providing extraordinary leadership in research, teaching, and learning for a new generation. Essential Qualifications - The successful candidate will have:

- a PhD completed by the date of appointment;
- a demonstrated track record of peer-reviewed research publications and other evidence of engagement in scholarship, commensurate with rank;
- expertise and interest in teaching in one or more of the following areas: Cognitive Behavioral Therapy; Adult Assessment; and Psychopathology/Diagnostic Interviewing;
- a demonstrated capacity for developing a research program in psychology;
- strong potential to teach at the undergraduate and graduate levels;
- interest and ability to supervise graduate student research as well as clinical practice;
- willingness to contribute to the administrative activities of the Clinical Program, the Department and University, commensurate with rank; and
- eligible candidates will be registered as a Psychologist in the Province of Ontario or will be expected to begin the registration process within the first year of hire.

Preferred Criteria - Preference will be given to candidates who:

- received a PhD in clinical psychology from a CPA- or APA-accredited program with pre-doctoral or post-doctoral training in adult clinical psychology;
- possess a strong commitment to the scientist/practitioner model;
- have a demonstrated track record of teaching effectiveness; and
- have expertise in an area that broadens the coverage of clinical topics within the program.

Application Requirements - a letter of application, including a statement of citizenship/immigration status; a detailed and current curriculum vitae; a statement outlining research interests and potential for scholarly achievement; samples of scholarly work; a teaching dossier or teaching portfolio showing evidence of teaching effectiveness and excellence that will include sample course syllabi/outlines, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy and interests (resources and templates for completing a teaching dossier can be found at www.uwindsor.ca/ctl/links-pd); graduate transcripts; and three (3) current letters of reference forwarded directly by the referees to the Head at the address or email listed below.

Only those applicants selected for interview will be contacted. The short-listed candidates may be invited to provide further information in support of their applications.
