Position Description

We are currently looking for a Health Psychology Post-doctoral Fellow to join the STOMP (SickKids Team Obesity Management Program) at The Hospital for Sick Children (SickKids). SickKids, affiliated with the University of Toronto, is Canada's most research-intensive hospital and the largest centre dedicated to improving children's health in the country. The STOMP team is an energetic, creative, multidisciplinary team dedicated to providing treatment to children, adolescents, and families living with severe obesity. We are seeking a passionate health psychology postdoctoral fellow to join our team and to assist with a new joint initiative with the hospital day treatment team. The patient population comprises a diverse mix of individuals with primary medical conditions causing obesity and secondary medical conditions

resulting from obesity. This position integrates clinical and research responsibilities as the team is required to demonstrate an evidence-based approach to this clinical activity and to create, utilize and/or disseminate new knowledge.

As a post-doctoral fellow, you will receive intensive training in pediatric and health psychology. This two-year training position begins on or before September 1, 2016, with renewal of the contract for a second year conditional on successful completion of the first year requirements.

- Diagnostic interviewing with parents, children, and adolescents
- Consultation and feedback to parents, patients, and inter-professional team members
- Individual and group interventions for patients and their families
- Consult with community, academic, and therapeutic intervention programs

Here's What You'll Need

- You have a Ph.D in Clinical Psychology.
- You have completed a CPA/APA accredited graduate program in clinical psychology AND have completed a CPA/APA accredited pre-doctoral internship in clinical psychology.
- You have internship level training in pediatric psychology and/or health psychology, child and adolescent psychopathology
- You have a strong skill set and interest in clinical research
- You must have excellent problem-sovling, time management, written and oral communication skills and the ability to work as part of an interprofessional team.
- You have completed all degree requirements before the fellowship start date.
- You meet the requirements for issuance of a Certificate for Supervised Practice with the College of Psychologists of Ontario and will pursue registration during the fellowship.

Salary & Benefits

The stipend for the 2016-2017 year is \$42,000 for the first year. Fellows are eligible for the modified SickKids benefits package (health and dental), 2 weeks paid vacation, and one week paid professional development leave.

Employment Type

Temporary Fixed-Term, 1 year contract with a possible renewal for a second year conditional on successful completion of the first year requirements.
